# A SUPERB DAY OF DISCOVERY FOR YOUR CLASS

Travel through time at our award-winning open air museum. Explore how people lived and worked in the past as you visit their homes and work places. Then picnic in our beautiful park and woodland.

From a replica Iron Age house to a 1947 Prefab, your students can experience a snapshot of 2000 years of Chiltern life, including houses and cottages, a working Victorian farm with traditional farm animals and rural industries.



## SO MUCH TO SEE AND DO

The Museum is a fantastic learning resource and supports the National Curriculum with a range of education services.

### ● Traditional Buildings and Crafts

Step into a 1940s home, visit a Victorian toll keeper's cottage and explore the blacksmith's forge. Our buildings are furnished and displayed to show how they were used in the past.

### ● Activity Workshops

Choose from a wide range of hands-on activity workshops designed to support classroom learning. We provide specialised workshops for each level from Nursery to Further Education.

### ● Themed Days

Fully facilitated visits on the themes Houses and Homes, the Victorians and the 1940s are available for Key Stage 1 & 2 pupils.

### ● Events

Our range of one day events provides a fulfilling mixture of costumed living history and hands-on activities for groups of all ages.

### ● Activity and Teaching Resources

**Free** Teacher's Resource Packs, activity information sheets, worksheets and other resources are available on our website. Free activity boxes can also be booked in advance.

### ● Vocational Groups

Fully facilitated visits on the themes of heritage construction and carpentry are available. Alternatively you can tailor your visit with us to support tourism courses.

- Where do I belong? (KS 1) - looking for clues to match the artefacts to their home.
- The Victorian Rural Child (KS2) - use the clues to find out about Martha, Caroline and other children who lived and worked in our Victorian buildings.
- Making do (KS2) - use the clues to find out how the war affected the whole family during World War 2.
