### TRAVELLING BY COACH/CAR

We are close to a number of main routes and can be reached from the M25 at Junction 17. Until May 2010 follow the signs to Maple Cross and then follow diversion signs in place on A412, which will take you through Chalfont St Peter and back onto Gorelands Lane. From there follow the brown tourist signs to the Museum.

The Chiltern Line and the Metropolitan Line to Chalfont & Latimer or Chorleywood stations bring you within a short taxi ride to the Museum.

From a replica Iron Age house to a 1947 Prefab, your students can experience a snapshot of 2000 years of Chiltern life, including houses and cottages, a working Victorian farm with traditional farm animals and rural industries.

Step into a 1940s home, visit a Victorian Toll Keeper's Cottage and explore the blacksmith's forge. Building interiors are furnished and displayed to show how they were used in the past.

Choose from a wide range of hands-on activity workshops designed to support classroom learning. We provide specialised workshops for each level from Nursery to Further Education.

### ● Themed Days

Fully facilitated visits on the themes Houses and Homes, The Victorians and the 1940s are available for Key Stage 1 & 2 pupils.

Our range of one day events provides a fulfilling mixture of costumed living history and hands-on activities for groups of all ages.
